Heritage Hills School Quick Facts:

HHE is a dual track school offering French Immersion and English Programming.

The total school budget is \$ 3,172,041 for the 2024-2025 school year.

Staffing accounts for 96% of the budget.

Approximately two thirds of our students are in our English Program and one third in the French Immersion Program.

Our current student enrollment for the 2024-2025 school year is 492 students with 132 in French Immersion and 360 learning in English.

- Continued use of tools such as RRST, DRT, GOA Screeners (English- PAST, RAN, LeNS, CC3 & French- TDCP, DRS, NSIe, CC3) and GB+
- Teachers will have access to high quality resources to support literacy instruction in both English and French
- Division 2 French teachers- collaborative working groups with ECSD to develop literacy resources
- Additional reading support from reading specialist for students just below grade level
- District READ program led by Tamara Martin-Spady
- HHE is a part of the EIPS Writing Pilot. Teachers will participate in professional learning, pedagogy and targeted practices around writing

- Provide support for the implementation of the new math curriculum and address learning gaps related to the new curriculum expectations by using district consultants
- Use Fact Fluency Kits and Strategies
- Continued use of math games, websites, apps, and common grade approaches to increase student mastery of basic math facts and to develop a strong sense of numbers and patterns
- Identify additional resources and professional learning opportunities, with the support of the EIPS Mathematics consultant, to assist teachers with developing student problem-solving skills
